- Has the capacity to devote a small amount of time to supporting the Trust outside of quarterly Board and Committee meetings, including at specialist

events.

Trustees are expected to attend four quarterly Board meetings, and this role will also become a member of, and attend Finance and Audit Committee meetings. There are four Committee meetings per year, usually two weeks before a board meeting.
